


OPPORTUNITY







he 2020-2021 school year was another year of challenge and perseverance as the pandemic continued across our area. But, as a result of the challenges we faced, we were also presented with opportunities. An opportunity for the community to band together. An opportunity for people to show the best of themselves. An opportunity to provide innovative solutions. An opportunity for students to be engaged in learning, whether in the classroom or at home.

Our community continued to raise funds for our students through the North Penn Strong apparel campaign, the Build-A-Bag program, and through participation and sponsorship of the Foundation's 19th Golf Classic. These events and other donations raised more than \$223,923.30. We are so thankful that through everything, our community has stood by our side and helped to provide what our students need.

Teachers discovered innovative solutions to keep students engaged while working remotely. In total, 17 grants were awarded to teachers to provide a better experience or enhancement to the curriculum for our students.

Educational Improvement Tax Credit Program

Pennsylvania's Educational Improvement Tax Credit (EITC), provides companies with a 75% tax credit for donations to a non-profit scholarship or educational improvement organization. The tax credit increases to 90% if the company commits to making the same donations for two consecutive years. The NPSD Educational Foundation has a number of programs approved to receive EITC Funding, including the project featured below.

NPTV Professional-Grade Studio North Penn High School Total EITC Funds Awarded: \$39,912.00 NPTV installed a 40-foot professional-grade news studio for the students in the broadcasting and video production classes. as well as the NPTV Club. The set provides the backdrop to utilize elements to help tell a story. All professional television



news programs use their studio as part of the storytelling process. Utilizing monitors and studio graphics, reporters use the set to make key points during reporter and interview segments while in-studio. Producing a script to incorporate these elements are skills students will need to succeed in college and beyond as they enter the workforce as producers, directors, writers, and reporters.

Augmented Reality & Virtual Reality Applications North Penn High School Total Awarded: \$65,000.00

LARGEST GRANT IN HISTORY

The Foundation continues to show its support of the NPHS Technology & Engineering Education Department by awarding another groundbreaking grant, this year in the sum of \$65,000. The grant allows NPHS to be the first high school in North America to offer the Spatial Computer Program to its students through a partnership with Notiontheory, a global leader in XR education and solutions, and Unity, the world's leading real-time 3D platform. The course, beginning in the 2021-2022 academic year provides students with the unique opportunity to learn how to design, develop, and publish Augmented Reality (AR) and Virtual Reality (VR) applications.



The emerging technology areas of AR and VR have seen widespread adoption and explosive growth across most industries. A study by PwC shows that the combined value of AR and VR could add \$1.5 trillion to the global economy over the next 10 years. And, Burning Glass found the demand for real-time 3D skills has grown 601% faster than the market overall. This signals a clear shift in employment needs as emerging technologies continue to mature at an accelerating pace.

The Power of PERFORMANCE

The Show Goes On for StringKnights Pennbrook & Pennfield Middle Schools Total Awarded: \$680.00 The Select Strings program in the NPSD has a reputation of demonstrable excellence that spans district, county, and even multi-state levels. Student musicians have consistently traveled and represented the best of North Penn in competitions, festivals, and touring concerts for over a decade. This year with most rehearsals, performances, and competitions going virtual, North Penn student musicians needed a way to perform at their highest level. The Foundation provided the Select Strings program specially calibrated USB condenser microphones that integrated with student musician Chromebooks and audio recording/performing platforms.

The Power of EQUALITY

Books About Race and Ethnicity for Elementary Students Knapp Elementary School Total Awarded: \$194.83 This project helps the diverse population of Knapp Elementary School by giving educators age-appropriate, diverse literature that allows underrepresented students to see themselves in stories. The literature packs include lesson plans to help Knapp staff guide and facilitate conversations about race within the classroom. This project allows all students to see new perspectives and helps foster empathy and acceptance for others who may appear different from them.

Using Math & Science in Baking Penndale Middle School Total Awarded: \$588.34



Students in 9th grade at
Penndale Middle School participated
in STEAM learning and career
exploration while baking and
decorating cupcakes using various
techniques taught by their Family and
Consumer Sciences teacher. Each
student used a cupcake decorating
set as well as their own supplies to
use math and science in baking and

making icing. Students then used fine motor and art skills by using a variety of icing tips to create a design of their choice.

#BUILDING STEM SKILLS

Building Math and STEM Skills While Remaining Socially Distant

All Elementary Schools Total Awarded: \$1,998.37

The Extended School Care Program received a grant from the Foundation to purchase single-player games and logic puzzles to reinforce critical thinking skills, build creative approaches to problem-solving and improve spatial abilities for all. Engagement in these activities became increasingly important as students needed to remain socially distant due to the COIVID-19 pandemic. Program participants at all 13 NPSD elementary schools benefited from this grant.

Each funded project not only enhances the curriculum but also provides a hands-on and innovative way for students to embrace and fully comprehend the lesson. When NPSD educators apply for these grants, some think of how this experience will affect the student in the future. Science and technology grants allow students to understand theories at the next level of thinking. Other grants allow teachers to think about how this experience will benefit students socially and vocationally.
